


# **GOUT**Virtual Monitoring Clinic



### What Is The Gout Virtual Monitoring Clinic?

The gout virtual monitoring clinic allows for patients to have their gout condition treated to achieve the target uric acid level quicker and be reviewed virtually by the AH care team. This service consists of telephone consultations and safety calls by a nurse. With this virtual clinic, you may choose to do your blood tests at AH, or at your preferred polyclinic before each telephone consultation. You will not be required to visit AH on the day of your consultation, saving you time and money.

## Who Runs The Gout Virtual Monitoring Clinic?

Trained nurses run the clinic. They work hand-in-hand with your physician, and alongside you to ensure your gout condition is managed safely.

# What Is The Purpose Of The Safety Calls?

To ensure you are confident of managing your condition, our nurses will make the safety calls with you when you start your gout medications. This will happen every two weeks for the first three months for our nurses to monitor you for any adverse effects and gout flares.

# How Many Virtual Consultations Do I Have To Attend?

The healthcare professionals at the gout virtual monitoring clinic will adjust your gout medications until your uric acid level is under control. On average, patients require two to four telephone consultations after the first physical consultation with our nurse, each held about two months apart.

Some patients may require more sessions, depending on their condition.

The nurse and your physician will collaborate to manage your condition and any complications. The nurse will assist to inform the physician if you face any issues. Your care team will arrange for you to return to AH when necessary for a consultation with your physician in the clinic, to assess and ensure your suitability to continue with the virtual monitoring programme.

### What you need to do:

- Our staff will inform you on when you need to go for your scheduled blood test at AH or your preferred polyclinic before each virtual consultation.
- On the day of your virtual consultation, you do not need to turn up at AH. Please wait for our video/ phone call.

Note: Patients who have been assessed by the nurse to require medical attention will be arranged to be seen by their attending physician in the clinic.

### What Are The Cost Savings?

### Traditional in-clinic model:

- 3 physical consultations with your physician in AH.
- Gout virtual monitoring clinic:
  - 3 consultations with your nurse.
  - 4 safety calls with your nurse.
- Cost savings:
  - Between 40-50%.

The above charges are correct as at July 2021. Our staff will advise you on the amount payable during your consultation.
